The Secretary's minutes from the voters meeting on July 28, 2024, written by Secretary, Kathy Nordby, were distributed and reviewed. MMSC to approve.

The Treasurer's report was given by Donald Albrecht. The report was distributed and reviewed. Don reported that all roof repairs on the church building are done, the website update is paid. Budget for 2025 will increase by 4%. A lot of projects were completed but all the funding came from the Orlin Knick investments. MMSC to approve report.

The Trust Fund Treasurer's report was given by Lori Cacka. The report was distributed and reviewed. MMSC to accept report.

The Board of Deacons report was given by Pastor Reed. Membership changes: transfer out: Jill Jaskowiak, Zachary, Mallory, Morgan Chmielewski, Christian Chmielewski released to St John's Lutheran Church in Winsted, MN. MMSC to accept.

Letters of introduction were received from both seminary students Immanuel is supporting. One is a first-year student, the other is a second-year student. This is a second career for one of the students. Letters are available to review by members.

Tuition Reimbursement- 13 applications were received. These are being processed by the Board of Deacons. Dispersement of funds will occur in January. The estimated cost is \$5,750. Funded by interest from Orlin Knick investments. MMSC to approve report.

Board of Trustees Report given by Dave Geier. The new skylight was installed in the Narthex. The ceiling fan below the skylight needs to be replaced. All the downspouts are now connected to the city storm sewers - this project is completed. Gutters on the parsonage are replaced. The AC unit is the balcony was replaced. Jordon Wendorf/Nick Neubarth will be doing snow removal. All cushions on the church pews have been replaced. The old table and cushions have been removed from the building. Thank you to Jeff Ribar for getting bid to install fire extinguishers. Mulch was placed in the preschool outdoor learning center. A sealer was applied to the outdoor preschool sign. Future projects include rewiring church lights, replacing roof on education building, replace window in the bell tower, replace cement in the parking lot. Other project requests brought forward are replacement of outdoor sign on the church building and to hire someone to come in and wash the windows a couple times a year. MMSC to approve report

The Office Manager report was given by Mona Geier. Preschool classes started again in September. Mona has taken over the financial items/tracking for preschool. Reported that Vicki is submitting data/info with Parent Aware Rating process-results will be released in January. The website is up and running. Have you ever noticed how children emulate their parents? Children watch their parents, and they do what they see them doing. This is how they learn to speak. They watch the shape and form of their parents' mouths, and they try to make the same shape so that they can make the same sounds.

But children copy their parents even on a more mundane level. They watch how their parents cross their legs, how they fold their hands, how they stand and sit and walk, how they do and say most everything: and children try to copy it. This can be quite humorous when caught in the act. They do this even when parents don't want them to. Everyone has been in the uncomfortable, and sometimes rather embarrassing, situation where a child does or says what one of their parents have done or said...something that is not too flattering! Sitcoms thrive on this sort of thing. And it only works because of the truth that children emulate their parents. And they do it because they want to be like them.

We are the children of God by grace, through faith. In Holy Baptism, God the Father declares of us what He declared of Jesus at His Baptism in the Jordan, "You are my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." God the Father claims us as His own. He takes away all our sins, and in exchange He gives us His righteousness, His purity, His holiness, and HIs Spirit, by which we cry out, "Abba, Father." We are born again, born from above, born of water and the Spirit, to a new life in Christ as His children. We are sons of God in Christ, through Baptism. And since we are sons, we are heirs; heirs who share in the glory of the Son of God. The inheritance is ours because of the Father's grace and mercy, because of His generosity in sending His Son in time to save us for all eternity.

And this is why we give generously of our income to the work of the church. Through the working of the Holy Spirit, we are enabled to lead holy lives. We are strengthened to emulate the generosity of our heavenly Father by being generous ourselves. We give to the work of the church because we have witnessed the generous giving of our Father in heaven. More than that, we are recipients of it. It is because we have received God our Father's gifts that we desire to give

ourselves. And His gifts are not just spiritual. They are temporal and earthly as well. As the Small Catechism teaches in the Fourth Petition of the Lord's Prayer:

"Give us this day our daily bread. *What does this mean*? God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving. *What is meant by daily bread*? Daily bread includes everything that has to do with the support and needs of the body, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, home, land, animals, money, goods, a devout husband or wife, devout children, devout workers, devout and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, self-control, good reputation, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like."

In other words, he gives us everything that we need for the care of both body and soul. His generosity knows no bounds.

Therefore, we sit down at the beginning of the year, the beginning of the month, or the beginning of the week, and set aside a generous portion of God's daily bread for His work in the church. Not because He has commanded us so to do. But rather because we, as His children by grace, want to emulate His generosity in our own lives. He is our Father; we are His children. And children want to be like their parents.
